Nature is the one who has the ultimate power to create and the ultimate power to destroy.


Every sunrise is a new day to start with new hope, new power, new determination, new goals, and a new me.


The next question that pops into my mind is, are taking care of Mother Earth?

Today, at this moment, they find meaning.


